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Supporting organisations through industry changes

The aged care sector have been contending with changes and challenges for many years. The industry is currently adapting to new:

- Service models
- Funding models
- Quality Standards

Wellness and reablement has been integral to the Commonwealth Home Support Programme for many years. However, the approach will ultimately be incorporated at all levels of the aged care system. Increasingly, providers will be expected to do tasks with clients, rather than for them. Staff will need to understand the principles and value of wellness and reablement and have the skills to implement them.

The challenges of change

The Bitesize series enhances knowledge about wellness and reablement (W&R) and develop skills to implement it. Organisations often need to upskill existing staff and orientate new staff to the W&R approach. Many providers do not have the capacity to develop in-house resources, nor can they spare the time and expense to send their staff for external training. This is where the Bitesize series can help.

Demonstrating evidence of organisational change and compliance

Bitesize learning can build workforce capacity to implement wellness and reablement. This in turn will enhance your organisation's W&R reporting outcomes as required by the Commonwealth government.

Using these modules for in-house training can also help demonstrate current and proposed quality standard outcomes relating to client-centered care and human resource management (see over).

How to use Bitesize sessions

Each module has:

- A Facilitator's Guide
- A Session Plan
- Activities to support practical learning
- An evaluation questionnaire

The PowerPoint slides are editable, so you can modify the notes section below the slides to meet the needs of your organisation. However, we encorage you to use the existing notes.

Bitesize presentations are perfect for staff meetings and staff development days. They can be delivered face-to-face or online depending on the needs of the organisation or the experience of the presenter.

Each presentation addresses a wellness & reablement concept. You can choose any or all of the presentations to meet your staff development needs. They are hosted on the Bitesize learning webpage in the recommended order of delivery.

Sessions can be delivered in approximately 30-45 minutes, to minimise disruption to business

Staff working with older adults in the community. This may include managers, care coordinators, allied health staff (including allied health assistants), support workers and even volunteers.
